
June, 2023, Fun Fly



Just as the stealthy B-2 Bomber is noted for being unseen, so was the relief from the heat and humidity during the June Fun fly. Dauntless pilots stood under a near cloudless sky resisting the unrelenting swelter. Their reward: favorable flying conditions. Winds were slightly variable from the SSW at 10 MPH and only occasional gusts. By day's end the number of highlights was many-fold.

Key highlights included successful maiden flights of a scarlet Freewing MiG 29 Red Star Twin 80mm EDF Jet, and a Banana Hobby B-1b Lancer Twin 70mm EDF Jet. Juan Galvez performed skilled maneuvers with his XPWR Edge 540t and low passes with his F-22 Raptor. Young Mr. Murray performed remarkably

well as a new pilot and with careful guidance, soon began to solo. Two *U-Can-Do's* flown by Bill Ponseigo and Richard Sanders chased each other until Bill had a flat tire which forced him to land safely in the grass. Phil Everman flew a classic looking *Freewing F9F-8 Cougar*. Sal Sordo crashed his *U-Can-Do* breaking the fuselage. Richard Sanders performed an aerial drop of his battery which prompted a search in the tall grass for the lost battery. The battery was not found. Later Richard flew a FPV drone from the comfort of the pavilion. Richard also flew a classic *Sig 4 Star EG*. And finally, Jeremy Cribb flew an elegant high wing *Sig Senorita* clad in transparent blue with contrasting white covering.
